## Advent Happenings

Our Advent adventure has taken us in two very different directions. The first, learning about Ugandan women and the beads that they make to support themselves and their families. The Social Studies and Religion teachers have presented lessons and shown a video about these women. Recycled paper is used to create their jewelry. During Tool Time, all of the students in our school as well as all our faculty and staff made beads and we will be turning them into necklaces and bracelets like the Ugandan women do. We have much to learn about this craft but we're in the process! The fact that this activity is associated with Uganda is so relevant to another outreach that we do here at St. Joe's.

For the past nine years, we have supported a young Ugandan woman, Christine Adhaimbo Odhiambo, who is mute and deaf. Recently, her family moved to an area of Uganda that is no longer served by the agency we work with.

We are now the sponsors of a young 10 year old girl, Goreth Namazzi, who is unable to speak due to a hole in her mouth. She and her family farm a small plot of land. Her job is to dig. There are fifteen people who live in her home which is made of adobe bricks, corrugated metal roof and an earthen floor. There is no electricity and water is available from a local well. Support of Goreth is not an Advent activity. It is year round and we look forward to writing to her in the same way that we did Christine, our former sponsored friend.

Our other Advent adventure was closer to home. Over the past three weeks, students have been bringing in unwrapped toys which will be given to children in southeastern Wisconsin at Christmas time. We did this in conjunction with **Kapco**, who sponsors the program, **Kids 2 Kids** and it's supporters: **620 WTMJ, Salvation Army** and **Blum & Colombe**.

The **Kapco** sleigh with Jonathan Green and Rudolph stopped at school on Friday, December 11<sup>th</sup> to pick up the toys we had collected. The Student Service Council helped fill the bags and boxes needed for all the gifts. We give many thanks to Ms Thachenkery and the Student Service Council for their efforts in promoting this collection. We can be very proud of the many gifts that were donated to help make Christmas special for the children of southeastern Wisconsin.

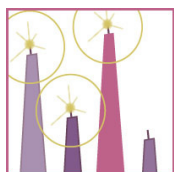
### Christmas Project
